Even though both women are especially pleased with their apartments, they admit what really sold them on Luther Crest was the active lifestyle.

"I looked at another community, but they didn't have all the activities that we have here," Raines says. "We have really good music programs, exercise, a swimming pool, lots going on. I have everything I need."

Dennis looks forward to dinner every night with a group of fellow alumni from nearby Emmaus High.

"There are 13 or 14 of us. We take up a couple of tables. They call us the Emmaus mafia!" she says with a laugh, adding that the entertainment is tremendous. "Tomorrow night we are having Oktoberfest, which means drinks, snacks and a polka band. Last year we celebrated 'A Night at the Moulin Rouge.' Christmas, of course, is wonderful. I am one satisfied customer."

Women's Retreat participants draw closer to God

In an effort to remind participants of the importance of taking time from their busy lives to reconnect with their spiritual lives, Luther Crest offered its first Women's Retreat in August.

Coordinated by the Rev. Virginia Heimer, Luther Crest's chaplain, the three-day event brought together 16 participants at the St. Francis Retreat House in Easton, Pennsylvania, where they focused on the theme, "The Spirituality of Aging."

"We did a timeline at the retreat where we looked back on our lives, how far we've come, the places where God was in our lives," Heimer explains. "We talked about where we are now with spirituality and where we are going and how we can be closer to God."

The three-day retreat also featured group activities, morning devotions, prayer services and private time to explore the grounds. It was a welcome experience for anyone looking to step away from life's busyness, according to Heimer.



"They realized that they do have to make time for their spiritual lives," she says. "We are so busy, whether working or retired, our lives are filled with so much. We sometimes forget to just be still, be quiet and just enjoy the surroundings."

While not the first retreat for Carol Landes, it was one of the more meaningful ones she has attended, she says.

"It was an amazing retreat. I can't imagine the hours Pastor Heimer and her helper spent in planning, preparing and delivering this retreat," she notes. "It was run beautifully and the handouts and conversations were just superb."

It also provided an opportunity to grow closer to other Luther Crest residents.

"Just being with this group of amazing women—some of whom I hadn't really known before—was very meaningful as we shared life experiences and some interpretation of religious thoughts and questions. It certainly deepened my thinking," says Landes. "Now that we have returned to everyday living, the challenge, of course, is to try and keep alive that which we experienced on the retreat through reading, prayer, meditation and just quiet time."
