

apartment to his room [in the nursing care center] without ever going outside in the bad weather."

With the decision made, Karen moved to Tower Court and Leonard moved from the rehab unit to the nursing care center.

"When I would travel from home to visit him [while he was in rehab], I would be here for two, four or six hours at a time," she says. "It has been so much better to be right here. This way I can visit him a couple times a day."

Karen also has found time to become involved in activities and make new friends. A fulltime organist before moving to Topton, she provides the musical accompaniment for resident sing-a-longs. During the recent IL Olympics, she played the national anthem.

"Everybody stood up and started singing," she says, adding how happy their response made her.

"I am so glad I moved to the apartments. I get to meet people in the hallways and talk with them. There are some here that are just real gems!"
